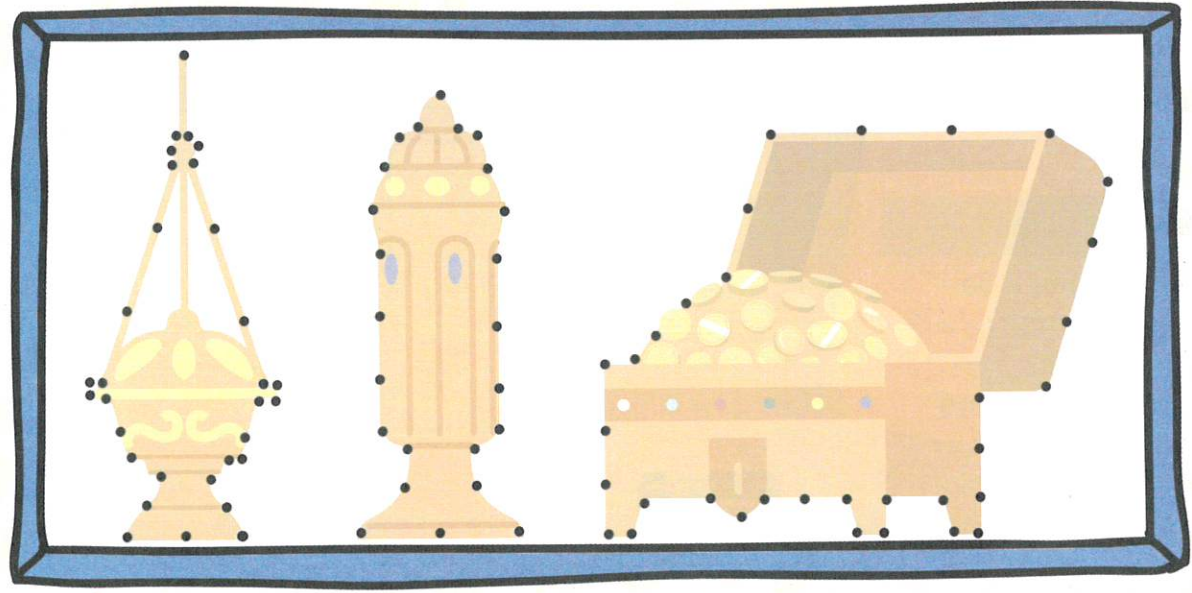

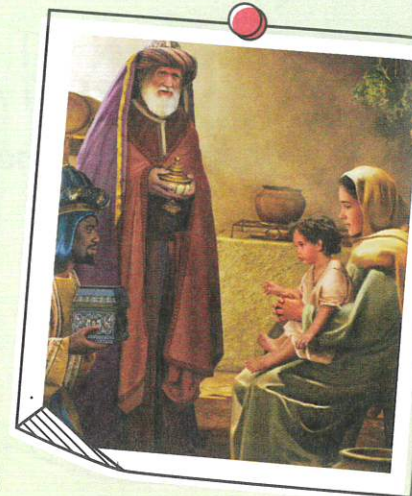

Wise Men Worshiped Jesus

BASED ON MATTHEW 2:1-12

WEEKLY VERSE: Jesus was born in Bethlehem. *Matthew 2:1*

LIFE POINT: People knew Jesus was God's Son.



In a place far away from Bethlehem, wise men were watching the stars. The men saw a special star shining brightly. This special star meant that God's Son had been born. They wanted to see the special child and give Him gifts.

The wise men followed the star a long way. When they came to Jerusalem, they asked about the special baby. King Herod was not happy to hear about Jesus being born. The prophets wrote a long time ago that a special baby would be born in Bethlehem.

King Herod told the wise men to go to Bethlehem. He told them to let him know where they found the baby. King Herod said he wanted to see Jesus, too.

The wise men followed the star to the house where Jesus and His family were. They bowed down and thanked God for sending Jesus. The wise men gave Jesus gifts—gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

In a dream, God told the wise men not to go back to Jerusalem and tell King Herod about Jesus. The wise men went home another way.
