

## Unit 8 • Session 4 SAMSON AND THE PHILISTINES Judges 13–16

## WHAT IS REPENTANCE? REPENTANCE IS TURNING AWAY FROM SIN AND TURNING TO JESUS.

The Israelites again did what was evil in the eyes of the Lord, so He handed them over to the Philistines for 40 years. The angel of the Lord appeared to a man and his wife. The angel gave them special instructions to prepare for the birth of their son. The angel also said, "Never cut his hair, because he will be set apart to save Israel from the Philistines." They named their son Samson. When Samson grew up, a young lion came roaring at Samson. The Spirit of the Lord came powerfully on him, and he tore the lion apart with his bare hands. Later, Samson fell in love with a woman named Delilah. The Philistines wanted to know why Samson was so strong. They decided to pay Delilah to betray Samson. Delilah said to Samson, "Please tell me, where does your great strength come from?" He replied, "If someone ties me up with seven fresh bowstrings, I will become weak like any other man."

When he was sleeping, Delilah tied him up and called the Philistines. He snapped the bowstrings as if they were yarn. Twice more, Delilah asked how Samson could be defeated. He told her two different lies. Samson finally told her the truth: "My hair has never been cut because I am set apart for God. If my head is shaved, I will be weak." She had his head shaved, and the Philistines captured him. They chained him between two pillars. Samson prayed, "God, please strengthen me once more." He pushed against the pillars, and Samson and the Philistine leaders died as the temple collapsed.




A prophetess who helped lead God's people to defeat King Jabin of Canaan. (Judges 4:4)
